CLASS G. Model Horse

Regulations

- 1. Exhibitors are required to leave two projects on display. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of all premiums.
- 2. ****NEW THIS YEAR**** Number of lots allowed per experience division:
 - Novice: 8 lots
 - Intermediate: 10 lots
 - Senior: 12 lots
- 3. Custom Classes must be exhibitors own work.
- 4. Each entry must include a 3x5" or 4x6" card explaining the breed, sex, color, place in pattern, maneuvers, etc. No more than 3 cards per display. (Mare & foal are considered one display)
- 5. Each model exhibited must have an identification tag with the project member's name attached to a hind leg; other exhibits, similarly labeled.
- 6. Advanced classes are encouraged to use tack and costumes made by the exhibitor but are not required to do so.
- 7. Model Horses need to be shown with appropriate halter/tack.
- 8. Showmanship classes may have a rider/handler with horse in hand or in saddle. To enter showmanship classes, an appropriate rider/handler with outfit must be used as the handler. Entry must have narrative card for Showmanship/Equitation entries.
- 9. ****NEW THIS YEAR**** If handler/rider is mentioned in information card for entry, display **MUST** include a handler/rider figure.
- 10. All training equipment/techniques/farm setting, over fence and trail classes must have proper training equipment, obstacles or training technique must be present in entry. Narrative cards must explain the purpose of training equipment or training technique or scene.
- 11. Champion and Merit awards are based on a point system: Exhibitors earn points for each class they exhibit in as follows: blue = 4 pts., red = 3 pts., white = 2 pts., pink = 1 pts. Exhibitors with the highest overall point total will receive the awards **for each experience division**. In case of a numerical tie, the judge will determine the winners at his/her discretion.

Novice: First year in project - max 8 lots
Intermediate: 2 - 3 years in projects - max 10 lots
Advanced: More than 3 years in the project - max 12 lots

Terms:

Custom - Remade, repainted and haired by exhibitor's own work
OF - Original Finish

Exhibitors must enter one division for all lots, either as a novice, intermediate or advanced at this show.

Eligible 4-H Project Areas: Animal Sciences - Pygmy Goat, Exotic Animals

Exhibitors may only enter in the department/classes that correspond with the 4-H projects they are enrolled in.

Regulations:

1. All exhibitors must read and adhere to the Youth Animal Exhibitor Code of Practice as stated on page 10.
2. Exhibitors are responsible for having read State, County and District Fair Rules and Regulations of Animal Health as printed in the front of this book (pages 8-9).
3. The exhibitor must be prepared to remove the animal from its stall or enclosure in order to present it to the judge in the showing or on the show table. Exception: Birds Lots 1 - 2.
4. Animal entries will be evaluated on conformation for their species/breed.
5. Animals shown in any other department will **not** be allowed to exhibit here.
6. Animals **not registered** to be shown here will not be allowed in the Pavilion at any time.
7. The Dane County Fair Association retains the right to reject or require removal of any and all entries when rules are not followed; when normal rules of animal care are not followed; and/or, when it would be in the best interest of the Fair.
8. **All exhibitors** are responsible for the daily care of their animals. Livestock exhibitors must clean up after their animals and regularly dispose of waste in an appropriate manner. ****FOR 2021 ONLY** Members of the Rona Club may house/tie animals with family members in a different club/chapter.**
9. Exhibitors may not enter more than one animal in each lot.
10. A project animal may be shared by exhibitors under the following conditions:
 - a) An animal may be shown in only one species or age lot.
 - b) An animal may be shown in only one showmanship lot.
11. Any animal deemed to be in ill health by the on-site veterinarian or Department Chairperson must be removed from the fairgrounds immediately.
12. If the animal being shown is owned by the exhibitor, that animal must be under the care and training of the exhibitor by **April 1**, and continue throughout the Fair. Exhibitors with managerial animals must be part of that animal's on-going training by **April 1**, continuing through the Fair.
13. Exhibitors are encouraged to enter Department 10, Class A, Animal Science Exhibits.
14. All ruminant animals housed in Pavilion 2 (other exotics) must present a Wisconsin Scrapies Flock ID at time of entry. **All goats require a scrapies tag.**
15. Exotics Showmanship Participants: Please wear appropriate attire (white shirt, dark pants). The lead should be short and dark in color. The collar should blend in with the animal's coat color and not be a distraction. Questions about attire or showmanship tack may be directed to the Exotics Chairperson.
16. Exotics: Please keep your exhibit area neat and appealing to fairgoers. Clubs are encouraged to enter Dept 32 Booths - A. Group Display - Lot 3, Learning Lane.
17. Bucks or wethers are not to be shown.

Eligible 4-H Project Areas: Animal Sciences - Cats

Due to the unknowns associated with COVID-19, ALL information listed in the Dane County Fair Premium Book is subject to change at the Fair Board's discretion.

Regulations:

1. ****NEW THIS YEAR**** All Cat exhibitors must enter through the **loading dock** of the Exhibition Hall and proceed to the front of Hall A for check-in.
2. ****NEW THIS YEAR** Cats in carriers ONLY, no harnesses or leashes.** Display cages will be provided. Each exhibitor must provide water. Each cat will be allocated one cage space 25 1/2" long, 22" wide and 22" high. Name, address and phone number of the exhibitor must be attached to the cage.
3. **Dane County Fair requires that all cats must be immunized for rabies, rhinotracheitis virus, calici virus and panleukopenia virus at least three weeks prior (no later than June 25)** to the fair and within the past year. Booster shots must be given at least three weeks prior to the Dane County Fair (no later than June 25). **A certificate of immunization proof is required.** Any animals vaccinated within three weeks prior to the fair will be sent home. This includes Ragdoll Cats. **For questions regarding health requirements, contact your veterinarian.**
4. All exhibitors must read and adhere to the Youth Animal Exhibitor Code of Practice as stated on page 10.
5. Cats displaying signs of external parasites or infectious diseases will be disqualified and sent home immediately. Check your cat for ear mites and fleas prior to coming to the Fair.
6. All cats, except kittens, must be under the daily care, feeding and supervision of the exhibitor by March 1 to enter. Kittens must be at least 4 months old by Fair time and under exhibitor supervision by May 15 to enter.
7. Whole adult males and nursing cats are not eligible for show.
8. ****NEW THIS YEAR**** Judging: Animals will be cage judged.
9. All cats must be removed from the Exhibition Hall immediately following the cat show and taken home. **Do not leave cats in vehicles after the show.**
10. Judging will include general appearance, health and condition, temperament, grooming, knowledge of pet and pet care.
11. Cat project members are encouraged to enter under Animal Science, Department 10, Class A.
12. No Cloverbuds may participate in Department 13 Cats.
